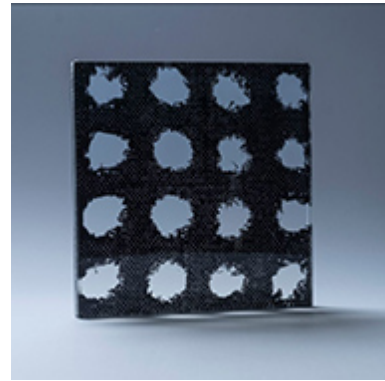

Product Description

Heavy Perforated Black is a laminated textile glass developed from coarse black linen that is perforated prior to lamination. The thicker linen fibers create a strong textile structure, giving the surface a pronounced material presence while maintaining controlled transparency through the perforations. The irregular perforation pattern allows light to pass through selected points across the surface, creating subtle spatial depth and shadow. The dark textile absorbs much of the surrounding light, while the coarse weave introduces warmth and tactile character that contrasts with the precision of glass. From a distance, the glass reads as visually dense and architectural. At closer range, the rustic linen structure, open fibers, and perforation edges become visible, revealing the textile preserved within the laminate. Heavy Perforated Black creates a balanced dialogue between visual weight and textile softness.

Material & Construction

- Laminated textile glass
- Textile layer: coarse black linen textile
- Irregular perforation pattern preserved within laminated glass
- Thick textile fibers embedded within the laminate
- Visible yarns and textile edges preserved during lamination
- Double-sided visual depth through textile structure

- **Thickness options:** 8 / 10 / 12 / 16 mm
- **Maximum panel size:** up to 2000 × 3000 mm
- **Processing:** CNC cutting, edge polishing, custom formats
- **Safety:** laminated; tempered laminated on request
